= 1st digital reading device in the world

SONY LIBLIe (2004)

= Model for Amazon's Kindle







Japan's 2nd Challenge


Frontier = Comics & love romances for mobile phones (A)
Rapid expansion of market for (A) = JPY 65 billion in 2010
Constant market for dictionaries = JPY 35 billion
Market share of e-books:

```
90 percent = for mobile = 80 percent for comics
10 percent = for PC
```

No clear business model yet for:

- * magazines (weekly & monthly)
- * how-tos
- * fictions

Breakdown by Category (total 77,773 titles)




Only a few are digitalized from among about 78,000 new titles being published a year.

e-Publishing: Slow Growth in Japan

Japan = 1/25 of the size of the U.S. 15,000 bookshops in Japan = Same number in the US Resale system = One price for one title in Japan Average US\$8.00 for a paperback in Japan Less bulky & smaller than U.S. paperbacks

Digitalization Idea by JEPA & Univ. Libraries

Frequently-read/popular books to **High priority** be identified by univ. libraries by the number of readers for each **Commercially** book viable = handled by vendors **Publishers/authors/vendors may** wish to handle commercially. (*) **Digitalization** (*) Publishers and authors express Open & = by us wishes by pushing an icon as to Free whether to keep their rights for publishing.
